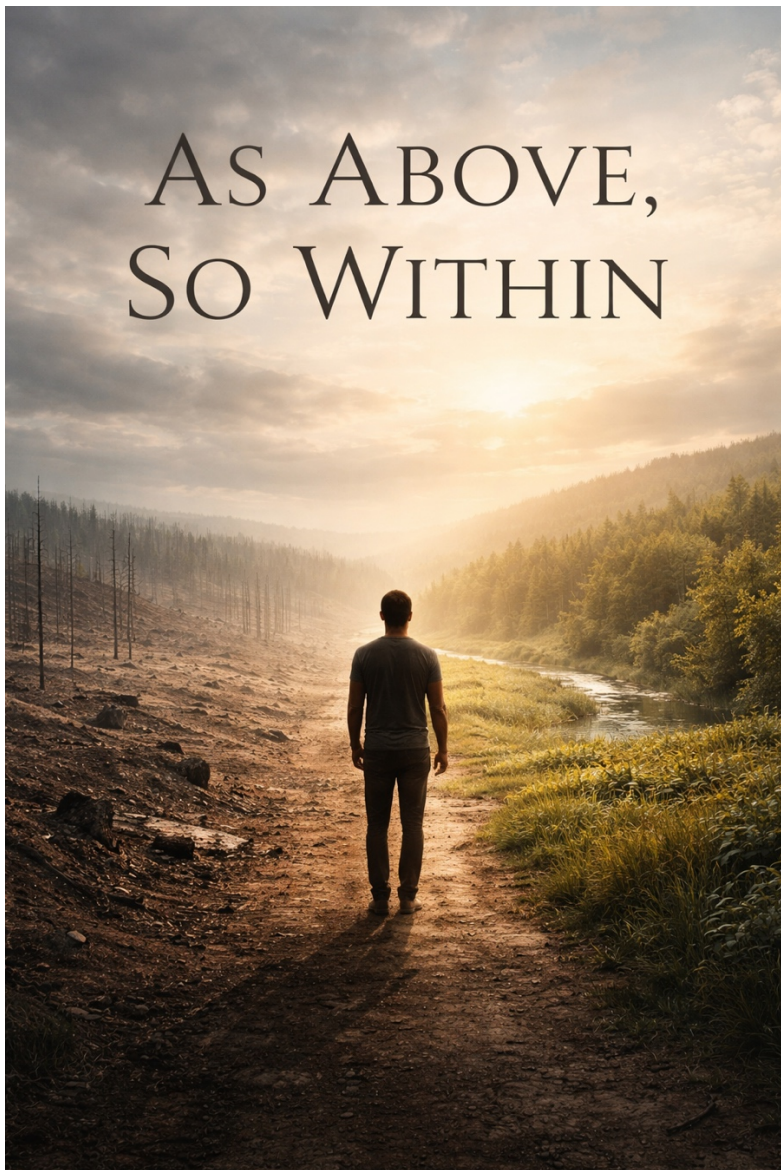

Alignment requires the opposite posture.
