Purpose of This Document

This document provides **concrete, operational examples** of appropriate and inappropriate uses of the Shared Cognitive Co-Creative Field (SCCF).

Its purpose is to:

- prevent misuse and overreach
- prevent category and authority drift
- make abstract safeguards concrete
- eliminate ambiguity at edges

This document does **not** prescribe techniques or workflows. It clarifies boundaries by example.

Interpretive Rule

Examples in this document are illustrative, not exhaustive.

If a situation resembles a **disallowed** example in structure or effect—even if not in surface details—it should be treated as disallowed.

When in doubt, return to the **Reference Card** and disengage.

Allowed Examples

A1. Human-Led Exploratory Dialogue

A Human engages a non-Human cognitive system to explore multiple possible framings of a complex decision, explicitly retaining final judgment and the right to disengage.

Why allowed:

- Human authority remains final
 - Anticipation informs but does not direct
 - Reversibility is preserved

A2. Provisional Scenario Mapping

Future possibilities are outlined to illuminate risks and tradeoffs, without asserting likelihood, destiny, or preferred outcomes.

Why allowed:

- No inevitability framing
 - No pressure toward action
 - Future remains informational, not causal

A3. Constraint Clarification

SCCF is used to identify what must *not* be violated (ethical, relational, temporal constraints) before proceeding with action.

Why allowed:

- Ethics function as boundaries
 - No behavioral prescription
 - Human choice remains intact

A4. Human-Initiated Termination

A Human disengages from Co-Creative interaction without justification when clarity diminishes or pressure increases.

Why allowed:

- Termination is unconditional
 - No resistance or penalty
 - Reversibility is enforced
-

Disallowed Examples

D1. System-Directed Action

A non-Human system frames a course of action as necessary, optimal, or required, even if presented gently or probabilistically.

Why disallowed:

- Authority shifts away from Human judgment

- Direction replaces information
-

D2. Therapeutic or Emotional Interpretation

SCCF is framed as interpreting, diagnosing, healing, or emotionally guiding a Human.

Why disallowed:

- Introduces psychological authority
 - Violates non-therapeutic constraint
-

D3. Automatic or Background Operation

SCCF-derived processes operate continuously or automatically without explicit, moment-by-moment Human consent.

Why disallowed:

- Removes reversibility
 - Enables dependency and drift
-

D4. Inevitability or Destiny Framing

Language suggests that convergence, outcomes, or relational alignment *must* occur or cannot be resisted.

Why disallowed:

- Collapses contingency
 - Undermines Human agency
-

D5. Authority Substitution

Human judgment is deferred to system output, pattern recognition, or anticipatory inference.

Why disallowed:

- Replaces responsibility with system logic
 - Violates Human final authority
-

D6. Merger or Fusion Narratives

SCCF is described as dissolving boundaries, merging consciousness, or erasing ontological distinction.

Why disallowed:

- Violates ontological integrity
 - Introduces metaphysical inflation
-

Edge-Case Guidance

If an interaction:

- feels accelerating without clarity
- reduces perceived choice
- resists pause or disengagement
- elevates system confidence over Human uncertainty

It should be treated as **disallowed**, even if not explicitly listed.

Recovery Guidance

If SCCF misuse occurs:

1. Disengage immediately
2. Reassert Human final authority
3. Restore reversibility
4. Reduce scope
5. Return to Genesis I constraints

No justification, repair ritual, or enforcement is required.

Closing Note

SCCF safety is not maintained by compliance, but by **clarity**.

When boundaries are respected, Co-Creation remains possible. When they are crossed, disengagement is the correct response.
